1.	December 17 <sup>th</sup>	<b>Prelims &amp; Mains:</b> Indian Constitution- historical underpinnings, evolution, features, amendments, significant provisions and basic structure. Separation of powers between various organs dispute redressal mechanisms and institutions. Parliament and State Legislatures - structure, functioning, conduct of business, powers & privileges and issues arising out of these. Salient features of the Representation of People's Act. Comparison of the Indian constitutional scheme with that of other Countries. <b>(Polity)</b>
2.	December 24 <sup>th</sup>	<b>Mains &amp; Prelims:</b> Indian culture will cover the salient aspects of Art Forms, Literature and Architecture from ancient to modern times.
3.	December 31 <sup>st</sup>	<b>Prelims &amp; Mains:</b> Government policies and interventions for development in various sectors and issues arising out of their design and implementation. Pressure groups and formal/informal associations and their role in the Polity. Development processes and the development industry- the role of NGOs, SHGs, various groups and associations, donors, charities, institutional and other stakeholders. Issues relating to development and management of Social Sector/ Services relating to Health, Education, Human Resources. Issues relating to poverty and hunger. Important aspects of governance, transparency and accountability, e-governance- applications, models, successes, limitations, and potential; citizens charters, transparency & accountability and institutional and other measures. <b>(Polity)</b>
4.	January 7 <sup>th</sup>	<b>Prelims &amp; Mains:</b> Structure, organization and functioning of the Executive and the Judiciary Ministries and Departments of the Government. Functions and responsibilities of the Union and the States, issues and challenges pertaining to the federal structure, devolution of powers and finances up to local levels and challenges therein. Appointment to various Constitutional posts, powers, functions and responsibilities of various Constitutional Bodies. Statutory, regulatory and various quasi-judicial bodies. Role of civil services in a democracy. <b>(Polity)</b>

January 28 <sup>th</sup>	<b>Mains &amp; Prelims :</b> geographical features and their location changes in critical geographical features (including water bodies and ice-caps) and in flora and fauna and the effects of such changes ; Salient features of world's physical geography; Important Geophysical phenomena such as earthquakes, Tsunami, Volcanic activity, cyclone etc.,
7.	February 4 <sup>th</sup>	<b>Mains &amp; Prelims:</b> Distribution of key natural resources across the world (including South Asia and the Indian subcontinent); factors responsible for the location of primary, secondary, and tertiary sector industries in various parts of the world (including India)
8.	February 11 <sup>th</sup>	<b>Mains &amp; Prelims:</b> Modern Indian history from about the middle of the eighteenth century until the present- significant events, personalities, issues; The Freedom Struggle - its various stages and important contributors /contributions from different parts of the country

April 8 <sup>th</sup>	<b>Mains:</b> Linkages between development and spread of extremism; Role of external state and non-state actors in creating challenges to internal security; Challenges to internal security through communication networks, role of media and social networking sites in internal security challenges, basics of cyber security; money-laundering and its prevention; Security challenges and their management in border areas; linkages of organized crime with terrorism.
